City Council Chambers. Join the Mayor, Ward 4 City Councilor Jon McCallion and Ward 4 School Bob Gibson to discuss Community issues, voice your concerns and help move Somersworth forward. Rep. Paul Henle will be speaking about the NH Tax Shift Plan - tax reform legislation he has put forward to provide \$500 million of property tax relief and \$500 million of business tax cuts. The lost revenue is replaced by revenue from a 3.95% tax on personal income. The Plan also reinstates the state's obligation to pay 35% of local retirement costs.
